





## Additional Reading in English



Some of the books will provide extra reading on a topic, theme, genre or author. Others may allow you to explore sub-genres or similar authors to the ones you have been studying in class.

Remember to share your learning journey and findings with your English teacher and your friends.








If you enjoyed The Hunger Games you might already know there are two more books to the saga and a new novel based in the same universe.





There's so much dystopian literature out there! Famous books that have influenced literature for decades or even more recent fiction, many of which have inspired films and TV shows.



